Substitute Teachers Needed

- All applicants must hold a high school diploma or GED.
- All substitute **teachers** must provide a copy of a valid teaching certificate **OR** official transcripts verifying the completion of 60 semester credit hours combined from one or more regionally accredited two or four year colleges or universities, with a minimum GPA of 2.0. As of September 25, 2018, a change at the State level now requires that all substitute teachers working in classrooms in grades 9-12 must be 22 years of age or older.
